Can I sell my vehicle without the V5C registration document? Apply for a new logbook via DVLA form V62 . If you have defaced or lost your vehicle V5C logbook, you can still transfer ownership of your car or sell it to a third party. It's also lawful to do so provided there is no outstanding finance such as a logbook loan or Hire Purchase.

The V5C logbook (also known as the V5 form or document) records the Registered Keeper (or Keepers) of the vehicle. Legally, that's the person registering and taxing the vehicle, not necessarily the owner. Normally the owner and registered keeper will be the same, but there are occasions where they might differ.
